#### **Members Shared Favorite Postcards at the January Meeting**

(more postcards in the next newsletter)

On the left, Dan Sak's 1931 Italian airline advertising postcard. Società Aerea Mediterranea operated from 1928 to1939. The card's Futurism artistic style is called Aeropainting and emphasized speed and technology. The Savoia Marchetti S.55 seaplanes shown flying are the same model that Italo Balbo used when he led 24 of them from Rome to the 1933 Chicago World's Fair.

On the right, David Parry's card of an earlier series of late 1890s Aloha Nui cards, distinguished by the POST CARD back (versus POSTAL CARD) for the other series. It was mailed to Krakow in Poland using an Hawaiian 2c stamp. The card is unusual for the 1c, 2c and 5c Hawaiian stamps in the message area on the front.




